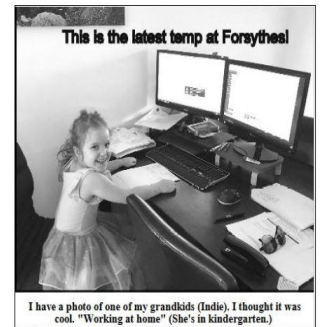
# ELECTRONIC LOUNGE

## Spelling and Grammar

When the party was cancelled it was then decided to hold a “zoom” party instead. We provided assistance by updating his laptop. You may have heard of the Free app “Zoom”. It allows allows up to one hundred people to join a meeting. All of the participants faces appear on the screen at all times. Go to [zoom.us](https://zoom.us) for more information. I am aware of two book clubs which are using the app, plus many are using it for day to day family chats. A widow, who lives at the end of our street, contacted me as her TV would not switch on. I visited her and found that someone had bumped the on/off switch on the front of her TV. It took 10 minutes from leaving home until I returned. A local took his laptop out of the cupboard after many months of not using it. Starting in February he came to the Electronic Lounge over many Fridays as we corrected his many problems. We upgraded the system, found that he had a faulty scroll wheel on his mouse, demonstrated how to store many emails that he treasured and open them correctly. He still had a problem that the internal and external speakers would not work. We discovered that a set of USB speaker did work and that Bluetooth ear pieces also worked. We recommended that he wait a month for the latest update to download and if that did not correct the problem purchase a cheap Bluetooth speaker. In the middle of March he phoned to advise that he had purchased a Bluetooth speaker for \$20.00 and was pleased with it as he could as he said “raise the roof with the volume it produced”. He required speakers to work as he needed to listen to YouTube videos to learn various subjects. How many of you do this.

their portable TV's along to be linked to the computer.
